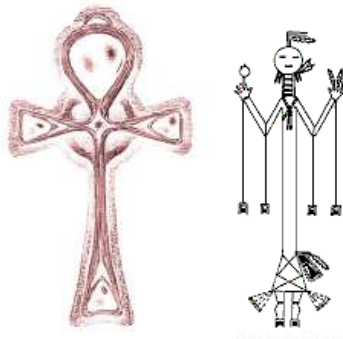


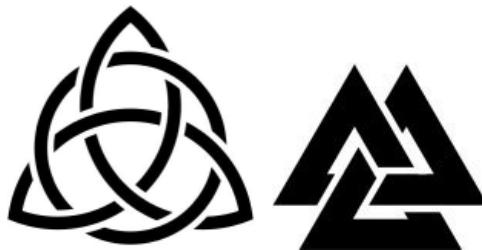
I.M.S.I Logo Explanation

Phasma Phasmatis – Latin for “spirit or ghost”



Egyptian Ankh / Navajo Yeii Spirit

The ankh was a symbol to the Egyptians that meant “eternal life.”
 The Yeii spirit is regarded by Navajo's as being a mediator between humans and their creator.



Celtic Triquetra (Trinity Knot) / Viking Borromean Valknut

This symbol is representing the three corners (Mind, Body, and Soul)
 Through modern times Valknut combines “valr” or “the dead or slain” and “knut” or “knot.”

I.M.S.I Logo Explanation – Part 2



Christian / Catholic Cross / Celtic Cross

Representing the three edges of the holy cross, which were the father, son, and the Holy Ghost.
According to Celtic / Pagan legend, the sun cross was supposed to give life giving properties of the sun.
